Ukraine Declares Energy Emergency as Winter Crisis Deepens



Ukraine has declared a state of energy emergency as Russian strikes on infrastructure continue whilst winter conditions worsen.

“The consequences of Russian strikes and worsening weather conditions are severe,” President Volodymyr Zelensky wrote this month. And it’s not only displaced families who are struggling to survive the cold, the Kyiv Independent reports.



Ukraine Declares Energy Emergency

“Pechersk, a leafy and affluent neighbourhood in central Kyiv, was once a symbol of comfort and stability. Its pre-revolutionary apartment buildings sit quietly behind tree-lined courtyards, far from the city’s main roads. In peacetime, many Ukrainians dreamed of living here.

Now, in the fourth winter of the war, temperatures inside these apartments have fallen to just 3°C without additional heating, and they are still dropping.

The thick brick walls that once insulated residents from the noise of the city now trap the cold inside. Large windows offer clear views of missile strikes at night, followed by the complete darkness of power outages, but they also let precious heat escape. After a mass Russian strike on January 9, one such elegant building is barely fit for habitation.

“This is the coldest winter I’ve ever known in this flat,” said one resident, who left her apartment days after the attack and is now staying with friends. “Because of the cold, the blackouts, and the constant attacks, it’s simply unliveable.”

Across Ukraine, civilians are increasingly sharing resources to cope. In cities, towns and villages, local authorities have established so-called Invincibility Points, sheltered locations powered by generators where residents can warm up, charge phones, and keep essential devices running. Mobile phones, often used as torches during blackouts, now require constant recharging.

And this is where support from abroad can make a real difference.

“Everything we supply as part of our winter campaign is important, but generators are more vital than ever,” says Mandy Haynes, Lead Trustee with New Forest for Ukraine. “Pre-loved units can be repaired and put straight into service, and brand-new generators can be purchased for around £300.”

With temperatures forecast to plunge to as low as –20°C in February, the need is urgent. As winter tightens its grip, practical support of heat, power, and light could be the difference between endurance and despair.




Resilience In Action

“When the power went out, I put my phone in my pocket and walked to the Centre of Resilience”.

I already knew the generator would be running. You can hear it before you get there. Chattering away with a noise that's begun to mean light, warmth, and a chance to breathe. Inside the tent there were extension cords everywhere and a long table full of phones, power banks, and chargers that didn't belong to anyone in particular.

I plugged in my phone and sat down. The battery was almost empty, and so was I. The strikes last night didn't allow for much sleep, and with the power cut my phone was the only light I had.

While it charged, I stayed. Someone offered me tea. A woman next to me was waiting for her phone to turn on so she could call her son. A group of kids were charging phones just long enough to send messages to teachers. No one rushed anyone else.





Resilience In Action

Charging a phone here is never just about the phone. It's about knowing you can call someone if you need to. It's about getting some news, sending a message that says "I'm alive," or just scrolling for a few minutes to quiet your thoughts.

The generator, possibly one provided by your charity, kept everything going. The lights stayed on. The kettle boiled. The small heater and other people's bodies gave us warmth inside the insulated tent. The phones slowly filled with power.

By the time my battery was full, I felt stronger too. Not because the war was close to being over, but because I wasn't facing it alone.

I unplugged my phone and stepped back out to face tonight's darkness.
Behind me, the generator kept running.
The Centre of Resilience stayed open, ready for the next person who needed to recharge, in every sense of the word.
"Can you thank everyone who helps with these petrol generators? Thanks."



The Thank You's Continue

As part of NFFU's monitoring of aid distribution, we include "Thank You" cards in Ukrainian and English with each shipment. These cards allow the name of a donor or supporter to be added as a personal message, and invite recipients to take a photo and send it back to us once the aid arrives.

This is just one of the hundreds of heart-warming messages we received this month, from a young mother named Katerina. Her message read:

"Hello, knitters! I'm very glad to receive your gift for my newborn baby. Thank you very much!"

Martin Plaut Running for NFFU

Martin Plaut is a journalist and academic specialising in conflicts in Africa, especially the Horn of Africa. He worked as a BBC News journalist from 1984 to 2012 and is a member of Chatham House. As of 2019, Martin was a senior research fellow at the Institute of Commonwealth Studies of the University of London, has authored multiple books including his latest 'Unbroken Chains', and a strong supporter of NFFU.



'I grew up running along one of the most spectacular routes in the world. On Table Mountain, with Cape Town spread out below me. As a young South African it was a joy to behold. But there was always something that wasn't right: it was Robben Island - the prison that held Nelson Mandela and other political prisoners for so many years. Today, happily, it is a museum commemorating its grim past. But I am - at the age of 75 - still running.

This April I will be doing a 10k for NFFU. Not just because the forest is so beautiful, but because the cause is so vital.



When I first came across NFFU I was blown away. Not just by the mountain of goods that have been taken to Ukraine, but by the passion of everyone who worked there. Whether they were packing in the hub or sewing at home, there was such love and dedication to the task.

And the people of Ukraine need it so badly! Whether it is the blankets so beautifully knitted or the generators that can replace the country's damaged power supply in the dead of winter, the aid is vital.

Aid Away - January 2026

As winter bites across the whole of Europe, our hub teams stay warm by working hard on receiving, sorting, checking, packing, palletising, and wrapping aid for shipping to our NGO partners in Ukraine. Those volunteer NGOs meanwhile endure even colder Ukraine weather to get the aid allocated and delivered to those waiting. It's not been easy, as January has seen a record number of strikes upon Ukraine including civilian transport facilities.

Sad to report that one Kyiv aid hub, used by Nova Poshta who manage our last mile deliveries to NGOs, was struck by a missile mid-January. The building was destroyed but fortunately this time no one was killed, and delivery of NFFU aid was not affected.

January saw our team process 28t of aid and share it over three 15.5-tonne articulated trucks. Load 63 departed on 6th January, Load 64 on 22nd January, and Load 65 on 28th January. These follow the 170 van loads sent before we transferred to the less frequent but higher volume truck loads. Including everything so far, we are proud to report a **738t total volume of humanitarian aid** shipped from Lymington by NFFU. We are amazed by what our community has achieved, and whilst it sounds like a lot, when shared between 4-5 million displaced, please be aware each family still gets a bare minimum

Aid Away - January 2026

After our sorting team's carton or bag items, using vacuum packing if required to compress clothing and bedding, they are shared into predefined pallet boxes to fulfil each NGOs monthly wish list. Pallet boxes are filled to the brim and capped with a lid, but moving 28,000 kg of aid in a single month is also a significant achievement for a volunteer team, only made possible by a steady flow of donations, a hard-working volunteer force, self-innovated packing techniques, and maximising every inch of space on each pallet and each truck.

Once filled, every pallet box is wrapped in black plastic for added security and weather protection, minimising the risk of damage to contents. Labelled with address and content details, and when sponsored a large message label, pallets are stacked one upon the other, ready to load 52 pallets that fill every inch of a truck.




